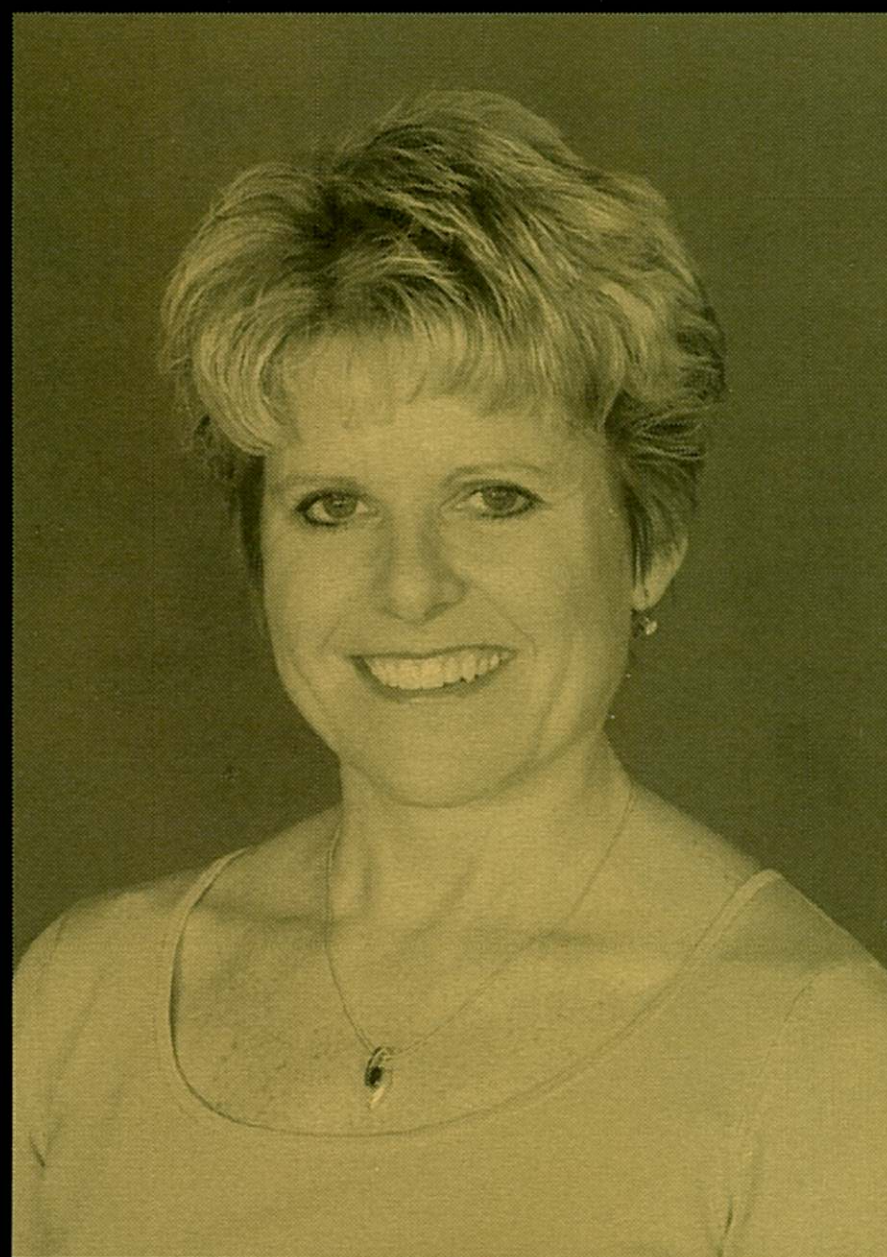

She credits the positive reinforcement she received from her parents for her active life style. They taught by example and she learned by watching how they lived.

At OFHS, athletics, Student Council, and several other organizations shaped her personality. Drama and music provided a solid foundation for performing in the spot light. The real spark for her future may have been her four years of participation in Future Business Leaders of America, including serving as president.

As a Class of 1980 graduate, Diane went to UW Stevens Point with a television news caster dream. She found her real love was marketing. Named Business Student of the Year, she graduated in 1984 with a double major in Business and Communication.

It was at Stevens Point that she met Rick Roundy another love of her life. Rick and Diane married and moved to Green Bay, where she became marketing director at De Pere Federal Savings and Loan. Ten years later she started her own consulting business. This led to a connection with Schenck Business Solutions. In 2001 she joined the firm to head the Business Development Department. Along the way she earned her MBA at UW Oshkosh.

She noted, "My whole perspective in life and in my job is to get people excited about what they do." "My Oconto Falls roots are a critical factor in where I am today. I learned that our 'small town ethics' of helping when needed, giving where possible and encouraging positive outcomes can be applied anywhere...in business, in community and in family...in large companies and small.
