Janet Piper Delvoye was born in Oconto Falls, graduating from OFHS in 1971. She attended UW-Green Bay, graduating from there in 1976. She went on to attend the University of Minnesota, receiving her Masters of Fine Arts from U of M in 1980. Janet has experience as a teaching assistant in the costume shop for three years, designing shows at the university, community, and professional levels.

In 1980, Janet won the regional competition for both costume and scenery design at the American College Theater Festival. Janet has worked her trade in a variety of locations including private business, on and off Broadway, Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade, Las Vegas, Ringling Bros. Circus, "Fraggle Rock", "Sesame Street Live", and the Metropolitan Museum of Art, to name but a few.

Her resume lists specialties such as jewelry construction, millinery, soft sculpture, masks, silkscreening, cutting and draping, dyeing and painting, soldering, and operating power tools. The spark that ignited this career for Janet was struck at OFHS by the theatre arts department. Janet worked mostly on the technical aspects of the plays. She did act in one however. At UW-GB, she worked doing costumes and scenery for a number of productions.

Janet is recognized for her contribution to the arts. Janet becomes the first female member of the OFHS Wall of Fame.
