In 1987 Bob was named to the All-State baseball team and honored as the 1987 Peshtigo Times "Athlete of the Year."

Bob attended the University of Wisconsin-Whitewater where he earned All-Conference and team MVP in baseball. Bob also has the distinction of being the first ever professional draftee at the University of Wisconsin-Whitewater. As a professional he was drafted by the Chicago White Sox in the second round of the June 1990 draft. Bob has played professionally for the White Sox, New York Yankees and the Milwaukee Brewers.
